How can I take part?

- Teams of two to five students
- The competition has three categories
 - 1) lower secondary school
 - 2) upper secondary general school/upper secondary educational institutions
 - 3) university/university of applied sciences
- The theme of the poster is Environment, biology or sustainable development
- Free entry
- Registration to the competition by 15 January 2021. The poster can be made during spring and autumn terms 2020 and in January 2021
- Submission of the poster to country coordinator 28 February 2021
- The winning posters of categories are published during the ISI2021 meeting at the latest and they continue to the international competition

- to interpret and present statistical results
- to develop your written communication skills
- to work as a team

3. Select the best poster in your school and send it in electronic format to your local country coordinator.
4. The winning posters will participate in the international competition, the winners of which will be displayed at the World Statistics Congress of the ISI in the Netherlands in July 2021.

ISLP Poster Competition 2020–2021: Rules

Participation

- You can participate in teams of two to five students. We do not accept work made by one person only.
- The competition has three categories:
 - lower secondary schools
 - upper secondary general schools/upper secondary vocational schools
 - universities/universities of applied sciences, Bachelor level students
- Posters must be submitted by teachers to country coordinators for entry in National Competition

 - Free entry

When?

National competitions

- Posters submitted to ISLP country coordinators country dependent
- National winners announced 28 February 2021

International competition

- The winners will be announced at the 63rd ISI World Statistics Congress the Netherlands in July 2021

Poster or research poster

- The theme of the competition is the **environment, biology or sustainable development**. The work must be based on the usage, analysis and interpretation of statistics. In planning the posters, it is important to take into account the judging rules of the ISLP Poster Competition.
- Data used can be collected by students or previously published by some reliable source (remember to give source reference and check their reliability).
- Posters can be made in one's own language or in English.
- **Posters must not contain any information about students or schools** who have submitted them (information is given in a separate attachment to ensure equal treatment).
- Posters from previous international competitions are not allowed.
- Posters must be the original design and creation of students.
- Posters must be two-dimensional (one single sheet) and one-sided. The maximum size is A1 (841 mm x 594 mm). The maximum file size of electronic posters is 10MB.
- Posters received after the established deadline will not be considered for the competition.
- All posters taking part in the competition become the property of Statistics Finland and the International Statistical Institute (ISI) and will not be returned.
- By submitting a poster, students give permission for their work to be displayed at various events and occasions and in publications of the International Statistical Institute, and in electronic format on the internet.
